• Fight Mosquitoes Naturally

The warmer weather also brings the return of mosquitoes. Help keep your property mosquito-free by eliminating standing water in flowerpots, birdbaths, or clogged gutters. • Compost Yard Waste

Instead of sending your yard waste to the landfill, why not try composting? It's a great way to reduce waste and create nutrient-rich soil for your garden. Mulching your grass instead of bagging it provides nutrients for the soil.

• Bi-Annual Hydrant Flushing

April 7th- April 11th Fire hydrants are flushed to ensure proper water flow, pressure, and functionality in case of an emergency. Flushing clears sediment, debris, and rust from the pipes, improving water quality and reducing issues like discoloration or clogs. It also serves as a way to test hydrants, ensuring they open and close correctly.

• Start a Spring Clean-Up

Spring is the perfect time to declutter your home and yard, but don't forget to recycle. Check with Public Works for guidelines on what can be recycled and consider donating unwanted items instead of throwing them away. For Drivers:
